Our Chairman, Robert Hurst, thanked all those who displayed material tonight the evening providing a wide variety of usual and unusual topics.

### 20<sup>th</sup> September 2011 - Christmas, Cocos and Norfolk Islands - Miss Margaret Noack

The atoll of Cocos & Keeling Islands was discovered by Captain William Keeley in 1664. It was annexed in 1867 by Queen Victoria. Circa 1900 Cable & Wireless laid two cables using the Island as a base to Perth, Western Australia the other to Singapore. Messages were sent by cable to Perth postal authorities who then transferred the message onto a postcard which was then put into the post. In 1937 its Post Office was closed due to lack of use. Margaret then explained how the Islands were used during WWII. 1951 saw mail sent from and to Cocos & Keeling transferred by tin can off the atoll and a year later an airport was built on the Island. A selection of stamps issued by Cocos during Queen Elizabeth II's reign was displayed until on 1<sup>st</sup>

January 1994 Australia assumed responsibility for all postal and philatelic services on Cocos & Keeling Islands.

Christmas Island off the North West coast of Australia was discovered on Christmas Day, 1643 (The other Christmas Island is part of the Gilbert & Ellis Islands) and like the other Islands shown tonight are but small islands in a vast expanse of sea. In the 19th century samples of rock were taken and were found to contain phosphate. Away from its coast the island is total jungle. CI is also noted for its crabs. During WWII Christmas Island was occupied by the Japanese from March 1942 until the end of the war. Stamps from Strait Settlements were used by Christmas Island from 1900 until 1942 and their own issues up until 1988 were also shown.

Norfolk Island was discovered by Captain Cook during his second voyage around the globe and immediately noted the tall straight trunk of the Norfolk pine trees (for replacement masts). The island was abandoned in 1814 only for it to be reoccupied eleven years later by some of Australia's most troublesome prisoners? In 1855 they stole the stamps and obliterator from its post office so replacements had to be supplied. The survivors from the Munity of the Bounty settled there in 1859. Its record of births, deaths and marriages were meticulously kept by Bishop Patterson. During WWII the Americans built an airstrip there and after hostilities ceased New Zealand forces ran a regular service between their two countries.

Stamps from Tasmania were used in NI from mid 1854 to May 1855 and the obliterator '72' used. New South Wales stamps were supplied from 1877 to 1913 when Australian issues took over until Norfolk Island made their own issues from 10<sup>th</sup> June 1947 onwards. At an international stamp fair in Hong Kong the Norfolk Island Post Office sold a miniature sheet was sold for \$2.50. With very few being sold two Australian stamp dealers purchased the remainder of their stock and resold them for \$250 each. Mrs Noakes did not advise how many they were able to sell (making their fortune)!

"The postal history of these three groups of Islands was unbelievable and she was very knowledgeable in her subject" commented Mr David Ainsley.
